## **Lunch Guests**

We welcome parents to visit the cafeteria for lunch time, but we have a few rules we ask that you adhere to.

- ⇒ Everyone who comes to visit will need to check in through the office first. We will verify that all visitors are listed in Skyward as a contact for the child, or we will contact the parents to verify that you have granted permission for the person to have lunch with your child. For example, an out-of-town grandparent is surely welcome, and they will probably not be listed as an emergency contact in Skyward, so we will verify that they have your permission to eat with your child.
- ⇒ Your child and the lunch guest will eat at the parent table. No other children can be invited to join, and outside food cannot be shared with anyone except your own child.
- ⇒ Please refrain from taking pictures or video that involve any children except your own child.
- ⇒ Teachers have limited time to talk in the cafeteria, as they are responsible for monitoring the students. Please avoid having extended conversations with the teachers while visiting for lunch.

## Notes from the Nurse: Keep the Flu Out of School!

The flu is spread easily from person to person. When someone sneezes, coughs or even talks, it is passed through the air and can be breathed in by anyone nearby. It also can be transmitted from touching an object that has the virus on it and then touching your nose or mouth.

The CDC recommends vaccinating anyone over the age of 6 months. It is a myth that the flu shot can give you the flu: it is not a live virus. The flu mist, however, is live and does pose a small risk.

Handwash for a minimum of 20 seconds with soap and warm water (sing the Happy Birthday song!). A second choice would be to use hand sanitizer.

Teach your family good coughing etiquette- always cough into your sleeve/elbow to prevent the virus from being transmitted through the air and on your hands.

And remember to stay home with flu symptoms so as to not spread to your classmates and teachers. A fever of 100.0 or higher requires your child to stay home until he/she is fever free **without medicine** for 24 hours per KISD policy.
